PRINCIPAL'S POST

Dear Parents & Caregivers

Welcome to our first Newsletter for 2022. The College continues to provide a safe learning and working environment despite the challenges of COVID-19. Our students started on 31st January and were welcomed into year groups and then into their GEM classes. GEM classes focus on our values of Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness and are a key focus in developing active and productive community members.

Covid Update

Recently we have been updated to Level 2 public health measures that will see the mask mandate applied to Primary students. All secondary students have been wearing masks from the start of the year and we will continue to support the mandate by insisting that masks are worn at all times in classrooms. We are also implementing further ways to minimise the risk of COVID-19 being transmitted at school including the restriction of parent-teacher interviews, postponing events, modifying timetables and break times where practical. We have a COVID Response Plan and processes in place in the event of a confirmed case. We will continue to provide communication to staff, students and the Community as soon as the information becomes available through CONNECT. **Please report all known cases and close contacts to our front office as soon as possible so we can maintain a safe environment for all.**

Caring for our Year 7's in 2022

Our Year 7 students have been transitioning into the College and have been based in our library which is now called Ngala Mia (meaning 'our space/hut'). Year 7 teachers have been collecting their students at the start of each lesson from Ngala Mia and then returning them back at the end of each lesson so that the students are supported during transitions until they are more familiar with the school. We have also rostered additional staff to be available around the school grounds to support with supervision of these students when moving between classes.

Testing

Our Year 7 students have completed PAT (Progressive Achievement Tests) testing this year as the cohort did not complete NAPLAN in 2020 due to Covid. Standardised testing provides important information that allows teaching staff to meet the academic needs of the students. All Year 10, 11 and 12 students who did not pre-qualify for OLN (Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment) based on their Year 9 NAPLAN scores, are sitting the assessment for the first time this year during weeks 5 and 6. There will be a second round for students in semester 2. Students are required to pass the OLN to achieve their WACE Certificate at the end of Year 12.

Canteen for 2022

We would like to welcome Illusions Catering who now run our school Canteen. They will provide a service to the staff and students 8am – 2pm daily. A canteen service is the best Wellbeing Program that we can run in a school. Students need access to healthy food that is affordable and nutritious. The range is impressive and has been well received by the students.

New Role - Career Practitioner

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I would like to take a moment to introduce myself. My name is Robb Howland and I am the newly appointed Career Practitioner at Yanchep Secondary College. I have 15 years' experience as a teacher specialising in English, as well as a number of other administrative roles relating to career and pathway development.

Last year the state government honoured an election commitment to support the state-wide development of 70 Career Practitioners across 70 WA State schools. Yanchep was one of the schools to receive funding for this position.

The Career Practitioner role is structured in a way that enables it to fit the contextual requirements of each of the 70 schools. In terms of our school, with such a strong Senior School pathway structure already in place, the elements within my role will focus predominantly around developing Career-based skills and awareness in our Year 7 - 10 students. These elements include:

- supporting students in developing work readiness skills and further bridging the gap between schools and industry,
- being a resource for teachers, to promote careers linked to their learning area,
- supporting teachers, students and parents to remain current in terms of emerging careers so that students can lead productive lives that benefit the communities in which they live,
- supporting students and parents to engage and link with career opportunities; to work with and assist teachers in making that happen, and connect with the workforce to make that happen (Career tasters/incursions/excursions),
- Providing support for Year 7 - 12 students to help them to develop an awareness and appreciation of the significance and relevance all subjects and aspects of their school life serve in terms of helping them to become successful, confident and career-aware young adults.

Ultimately, I am here to support **all** students, parents and staff, and to be the bridge between school and the pathways beyond school, whether it be employment or further studies.

Year 9 Portfolio Creation

One of my first tasks at Yanchep SC is to support Year 9 students in developing a 'Digital portfolio' that will be housed on the school's internal network. The aim of this portfolio is to provide all Year 9 students with a safe and secure location in which to store relevant documents that they may/will require as and when they decide to undertake part-time/full-time work, or explore further study options.

Over the coming months, and with your awareness and permission, Year 9 students will work on completing a series of tasks during their morning GEM sessions including:

- Creating a CV/Resume
- Obtaining a Tax File Number (this will only take place with parent/carer permission)
- Opening a bank account (this will only take place with parent/carer permission. Also, we have no affiliation with particular banking companies, so the bank will be determined by individual student choice, in collaboration with parents/carers)
- Unique Student Identifier (USI) – This is required for any student wishing to undertake further studies at a TAFE or other Vocational Institution, as well as for all Trainees and Apprentices.

Students will be undertaking these tasks during their Wednesday morning GEM classes from 9:30am – 10:00am. It would be fantastic to have all students present during this time as this is the only space throughout the week when students will have access to computers for this purpose.

Friday 11th February 2022


Adventure World presented a fun packed day for Yanchep SC Year 12 students.

What changes have Yanchep Secondary College implemented to minimise risk of possible transmission of COVID-19:

- ◆ Staff are stationed the front gate every morning handing out masks to those students who have forgotten to bring one
- ◆ The Café has been divided into two sections with Years 7-9 entering one side and Years 10-12 the other side.
- ◆ Each toilet block has been allocated to two year groups
- ◆ All whole school and year group assemblies have been cancelled - alternative options are being used
- ◆ All Learning Areas now have hand sanitiser, wipes and masks have been provided
- ◆ Ventilation posters have been displayed in most classrooms. Instructions are that windows need to be open and fans on.
- ◆ All Lower School classes have been provided with a daily mask break - an appropriate time during the lesson students are escorted to an area outside, instructed to move 1.5 metres away from each other and remove their masks for 5 minutes.
- ◆ Implemented new Student Services COVID-19 protocols for Unwell Students
- ◆ Implemented Student and Staff Case Incident flowcharts
- ◆ Documented all COVID related processes in the YSC COVID-19 Response Plan
- ◆ Monitoring and tracking all Staff & Students who are either:
 - close contacts
 - potential close contacts
 - positive cases
- ◆ Provide regular COVID updates to the community via CONNECT
- ◆ Proof of Vaccination must be provided for all contractors, external agencies wanting to attend the College
- ◆ All school staff meetings are no longer done in rooms they are done via Webex
- ◆ All Yanchep Secondary College staff are triple vaccinated
- ◆ Additional cleaning has been provided


Inter-house Swimming Carnival 2022



Students enrolled in a VET Delivered to Secondary Students course attend a North or South Metropolitan TAFE campus one or two days per week.

North and South Metropolitan TAFE offers a range of courses and pre-apprenticeships as part of our VET Delivered to Secondary Students programs.

VET Delivered to Secondary Students courses allow you to:

- Develop industry-specific skills
- Gain nationally recognised VET qualifications and units of competency while completing your Western Australian Certificate of Education
- Develop employability skills

Gain an understanding of the world of work, providing you with valuable experience to assist with planning and pursuing your career pathways.

Yanchep Secondary College has 33 students enrolled this year and already attending their courses weekly.



